PHIL'S-OSOPHY #2

Good morning, afternoon or evening depending on where you are reading this,

When we last met, I was telling of the journey to where we now find ourselves. It is really a trip I enjoy sharing with you. Here we find ourselves running out of room in our new church building. We had two buildings on the campus site with the Sanctuary, (now the youth building) and the Aldersgate House, (no longer here). The offices were moved from the AH to the Sanctuary. It was easy to make the move since we only had the pastor and secretary on staff. But now we had three classrooms available in the AH and boy, were they needed.

We continued to be blessed and the church was growing. We soon found the need for more space. And as God continued to bless Aldersgate, we found two classroom trailers available from Immaculate Conception Church and



School in Springfield. The diocese was so generous to us as they allowed us to make payments to them and the price was incredible. The trailers allowed for us to have 4 more classrooms and they were soon much too small.

The church decided it was time for a building project, so we embarked on a second building project. The trailers had to go as we were looking for the new building to be on that location. The contractor bought the trailers from us for what we paid for them and there was great joy as the building went up. The CLC came to be and not too soon as we had to move our worship services into the gymnasium to accommodate the

larger numbers now attending Aldersgate. It was inspiring to witness the families coming and the growth spiritually as well.

The growing pains continued but we always found a way with the help of the Holy Spirit to see to it that classroom space and ministries had a place to do the work we have been called to do. Fast forward to 2006...

Aldersgate had been served by 4 pastors from the very beginning until 2006. Rev. Rob Winger, Rev. Bill Koch, Rev. Dr. Lee Strawhun, (Lee left to serve at Asbury Seminary in Dec. 2005), and Rev. Dick Curry as interim pastor. I was called to the church as the Executive

Administrator in June 2003. Sarah and I spent a lot of energy and tears trying to get this church moving forward in the simple operations of the facility and the office. We were no longer the small church as our growth demanded us to move our being able to do ministry to a higher level.

The Bishop appointed our new pastor to begin serving Aldersgate on July 1, 2006. We were blessed to have an

experienced youth pastor from Springfield King's Way UMC. Rev. Dennis Miller brought not only his church experience to us but the interesting thing about his coming here was as an attorney he was involved with the purchase of the land we are now using as our campus. And what a blessing we have again received from our Heavenly Father.

It hasn't been all strawberries and cream as the challenges have been present throughout the history of our church. As we have grown, so many have said how great that is and it is, but with the growth came the problems growth brings. Stay tuned as next time I will share some of the struggles and how God continued to bless this church we call Aldersgate.





We just celebrated the season of Advent for Christians; meaning we are expecting the second coming of the Lord Jesus. Although we celebrate His birth, we as Christians know He has already come once and is coming back soon.

I've been studying the many names of Jesus, 14 in the Bible, to discover the meaning behind the names. All of us have names, but do we know what they mean and how the names came to have a specific meaning? Jesus was called by 14 different names in the Holy Scriptures, and each has a specific meaning.

One of my favorites is Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Prince of Peace. The reference for these names is found in the book of Isaiah, chapter 9: 1-3 and 6-7. When we consider Jesus as a Wonderful Counselor, we need to look deeper to discover its true meaning. Wonderful shows us a God that is out of the ordinary and does amazing things. Counselor indicates a wisdom that goes way beyond what we have within ourselves or can even understand sometimes. In Hebrew times, a counselor referred to a King giving counsel to his people. Today, we are the people of God in this same way.

When we consider Jesus as Mighty God, we are reminded of His protection and provision. He is strong when we aren't. He will protect us when we need to be defended, especially from the Evil One.

When we consider Jesus as the Prince of Peace, we are reminded that we serve a God of peace, who came to bring ultimate peace to the world. Jesus came not to bring peace as in the absence of war or conflict, but peace between God and man, who were separated by sin. He died to reconcile sinners to a holy God. Thank you, Jesus, for your goodness and for bringing us back into relationship with our loving God.

Another of my favorites is the name, Jesus, as found in Matthew 1 and Luke 2. The name, Jesus, means Savior. It is the modern-day version of the Hebrew name Yeshua. This was the name that Joseph and Mary were instructed to call their son, because He would become the Savior of the world. This was a specific name for a specific role. Jesus came to the earth as a baby, but his specific role was to save sinners from the guilt and shame of their sin, through the shedding of His blood on the cross. More than that, as if that wasn't enough, He will save us from the consequences of sin, eternal death, and ensure our right to stand with Him and God for eternity. Jesus took on this role as Savior, knowing that it would take him to the shame of the cross, for all humankind. Therefore, we can approach God with confidence, resting in the saving work of Christ Jesus. Indeed, Jesus is the sweetest name of all.
