SEPTEMBER LIBRARY UPDATES

Did you know that our church library has Bibles? Not to be checked out, but to take home with you. We have several different versions to choose from, such as the New Oxford Annotated Bible, the NKJV Study Bible, the English Standard Version Bible, the NIV Study Bible, the Living Bible, and more. So, if you would like to have a different version of the Bible to enhance your understanding of the Bible or if you have a family member or a friend that needs a Bible, please stop by the church library and take one home. There is also one Bible cover that was donated and is free to anyone that can use it. The cover is located with the Bibles on the bottom of the right-hand bookshelf under the wall-mounted TV.

This month's book from our "Biographies/Autobiographies" category is <u>A Heart for Freedom</u> by Chai Ling. Ms. Ling introduces herself in these words "I was born at the beginning of China's Cultural Revolution. Like all

Chinese children, I was taught to love my country, sacrifice my own needs, and be ready to give up my life for a greater good. We were not allowed to know God. In 1989, I became a leader of a student hunger strike in Tiananmen Square, a peaceful movement for a better, freer, and more loving China. There I discovered the truth about the government I had been taught to love. In the early-morning hours of June 4, I stood with my friends and watched in horror as the tanks rolled in. During the crackdown, thousands were wounded or killed." After escaping to freedom and achieving her American dream, she felt trapped between her past and the future. She felt haunted by memories of standing against the force of a powerful regime, she had lost her purpose, her homeland, and her strength until God met her and healed her.



This is truly a powerful witness of how God can change someone's life in a very dramatic way.

This month's book from our "Discipleship" category is <u>Real Followers</u> by Michael Slaughter with Warren Bird. Mike Slaughter, pastor emeritus and global church ambassador for Ginghamsburg Church, served for nearly four decades as the lead pastor and chief dreamer of Ginghamsburg and the spiritual entrepreneur of ministry marketplace innovations. He is also the author of <u>Spiritual Entrepreneurs</u> and <u>Out on the Edge</u>, both best sellers. Warren Bird, Ph.D., researches cutting-edge churches and works with their leaders to multiply their evangelistic and disciple-making impact. He has authored or co-authored over 30 books, receiving several awards along the way. This book teaches you how to think God's thoughts as the key to discerning God's will. You will understand that personal desires and ambitions can be aligned with God's dreams for your life. You will realize that there are no three-step or twelve-step techniques for becoming a Real Follower. You will understand, especially from the examples in the book, why high commitment to God's dream for your life involves cost and sometimes suffering. There are real-life examples in each chapter that illustrate how a person moved from low-commitment pretense to finding God's purpose for them. There are also discussion and journaling questions that can be used to enhance your devotional time.

MATTHEW 22:37-38 DEUTERONOMY 6:5-8

I've been asked many times, "How is it with your soul?" At first, I'm not sure how to answer the question because I must stop and think, what is my soul?

I don't believe it's just my spiritual life, although modern culture defines it that way. Therefore, it must be more than that. I think it involves everything about me, my personality, my will, my thoughts, in other words, my inner life. In the Law and most of the Old Testament, the soul is almost always linked to the heart, as in many of the Psalms. In the story of Job, it's almost always a place of bitterness.

What does it mean when God tells us to worship Him with all our soul? It means that deep down where we wrestle with the desires of right or wrong, God must reign. It means that there is no corner of our lives where God is not involved. It means that we love Him and follow Him like our lives depended on it. And you know what? It does.

Why is that so hard to do? Because it must be real, all or nothing. If we profess to believe in Him and pledge ourselves to Him, then it's 100%, nothing less.

It is hard to define the soul, but God has asked us to love Him with it. Our life becomes all about Him, our commitments, our passions, our drives, our motives, our thoughts, our feelings, our will, and our ways. Our soul is the center of our lives, and God should be the center of our soul.

I just finished reading a book titled <u>A.D. 33</u> by Ted Dekker. This is the first book I've read that explains what it means to give of yourself wholly to God through His Son Jesus. I recommend it highly. I'm not sure if the church library has a copy, but if not, I'm going to see that it has one soon.

The original amount of the loan for the new Learning Center was \$4,162,200.The current balance as of August 31, 2022, is \$3,412,246.

You have probably noticed the prices of a lot of things have gone up over the last several months. The church is not immune to this inflation, and as we enter the annual season of preparing budgets for next year, we are faced with challenges. We must consider we have been operating with a deficit throughout 2022, despite controls to hold spending below budget. We also must acknowledge that the cost of about everything are going up; plus, our staff needs and deserve cost-of-living adjustments or more. The ongoing discussions about the future of Aldersgate and the United Methodist Church add another element of uncertainty.

The answers to these challenges may not be clear, but the clear path to the answers is faith and hard work. God is alive and working. There have been many new faces at church lately, which is exciting! I hope any person that attends for the first time will not see a challenged group, but a family of followers who are living and giving faithfully!

Every member of the body has great gifts. If you are able to share financial gifts, then give as much as you are led. If you are gifted in playing music, teaching, cleaning, or fixing... then share those blessings as much as you are led! May we continue to look to the Holy Spirit as our source of hope and joy!

BE PREPARED

She will have informative booklets and fill-in-the-blank forms will be available for you to complete with your wishes and desires, and they can be notarized on the spot, or you can take them home and pray over them before finalizing. We will answer your questions about why this is so important to you and your loved ones and touch on the topic of whether advance directives are Biblical and why everyone needs one.
