Finance Brief

The original amount of the loan for the new Learning Center was \$4,162,200. The current balance as of December 31, 2023, is \$3,255,484.

We ended the year by covering our normal annual operating expenses! Giving for the month of December was \$208,958! This is compared to our monthly average of about \$83,000 over the first eleven months of the year. We weren't able to cover the one-time disaffiliation costs we incurred during 2023, but considering the operating deficit we were facing a couple of months ago, getting back to covering our normal annual costs is a huge blessing.

We are now finished paying disaffiliation costs, and no longer have to pay apportionments to a larger governing body, so we can focus fully on funding our ministries and paying off our debt. As has been discussed, the principal payments on the loan are included in the operating budget for 2024. If you have been directing any of your offerings to the Legacy fund to help with loan principal payments, that is no longer necessary, although you may still make gifts to the Legacy fund if you would like those gifts to be used for additional principal payments to pay down the debt, on top of the required monthly loan payments.

Also, while there are no future disaffiliation costs to be paid, we need to "pay ourselves back" for the costs paid in 2023. We ended the year with about \$129,000 of disaffiliation-related expenses that weren't covered by 2023 giving. We need to strive for a budget surplus in 2024 to replenish the deficit that was incurred in 2023.

Year-to-date financial summary through December 31, 2023:

Revenue \$1,124,711
Expenses \$1,253,969
Total net deficit \$(129,258)
Disaffiliation costs \$142,349
Annual operating surplus \$ 13,091

The bottom line is, Aldersgate Church has been, and continues to be, extremely blessed. Attendance has been up recently, giving units are increasing, and total giving in 2023 was up about 4% over 2022. We ended the year covering our normal annual operating expenses, and we are moving forward into a bright future. May 2024 be a year of growth for each of us!



The Red Envelope fundraiser is for student missions and activities. All offerings received will go toward helping the students of Aldersgate serve God's people locally and nationally. Each envelope has a dollar amount listed. With envelopes ranging in price from \$1-\$150, there is sure to be an envelope to fit any budget. Supporting our students through this campaign requires as little as picking up an envelope that best meets your planned gift and returning your gift one of three ways:

- 1) By a one-time offering through the Aldersgate Church App (designation Red Envelope)
- 2) Dropping your red envelope with the enclosed gift in the Sunday morning Worship offering
 3) Dropping it off at the church office

If you are unable to find an envelope that matches your desired gift amount there will be blank envelopes, because all offerings are welcome and valued.

Please take the time to pray about your gift to the youth of Aldersgate and fill an envelope during the month of February. This campaign can pave the way to spiritual growth and ministry beyond our campus.

We are excited to welcome The Class of 2026 to our five main leadership teams! Each team is organized into "classes" with each class serving a three-year term. This means only about one-third of each team changes each year to support leadership consistency, unless someone decides to serve another term. We also welcome Ed Vigneaux as our new Lay Leader, and new Church Board members Stephanie Scott (Stephen Min Leader) and Linda Merkling (LDT Vice-Chair) who have filled the seats added by the Board at their January meeting.

What does each team do? Glad you asked!

- Finance guides the financial business of the church and prepares an annual budget to be submitted to the Church Board for approval.
- Leadership Development helps match each person's spiritual gifts to ministry opportunities in the church.
- Property Oversight maintains our property and facilities.
- Staff-Parish Relations functions as the Human Resources department of the church.
- The Church Board is the governing body of Aldersgate.
- The Task Force was authorized by the Church Board to research other Wesleyan denominations we might want to affiliate with and provide that information to the church. This is a BIG task and we look forward to hearing more from them later this year.

This past year has brought so many changes to Aldersgate. We give special thanks to those leaders who helped us navigate

the changes in 2023 and have completed their terms of service: Jenaleigh Lathrop (SPR), Ryan Thomassen (Chair), Shawn Lucas and Jan Mann (Property Oversight); and Karen McClanahan, Marce Saylor and Cathy Carter (LDT), and Julie Ellis for serving as our Lay Leader.

Mark 10: 17-31

Connectional or Independent - what's the difference?

The Affiliation Task Force has certainly been learning a lot about Wesleyan theology and doctrine and have been sharing that with you in past articles. We have said from the beginning that we are not decision-makers, just merely the ones doing the deep dive. Our task is to share with the Board and the congregation our findings and recommendations. In the meantime, it is important to us to not only share our process but to share information. If you become curious as you read these articles, please ask us questions. We want to know what you are thinking or have concerns about. I promise we will listen.

It's important to approach decision-making prayerfully, seeking wisdom from God, and align decisions with biblical principles. Proverb 16:3 (NIV) "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and He will establish your plans."

The primary question is: does Aldersgate connect (affiliate) with a denomination or not? Read on to learn some of the differences.

A connectional church joins a denomination and becomes integrated with other churches. This concept has several important aspects:

- · shared doctrine, beliefs, and practice,
- interconnected leadership, governance, accountability, and
- promotes unity in sharing a common purpose and mission,
- shared resources for mission work, outreach and education,
- · a sense of tradition connecting to historical roots of their faith

An independent church operates on its own, without formal ties or affiliation to other churches or a larger denominational structure. Here are key features of independent churches:


- form their own doctrinal beliefs and theological perspectives such as on the sacraments, salvation, creation, the role of the Holy Spirit,
- · have the freedom to interpret the Bible within that framework,
- · flexibility in worship practices, rituals and liturgy,
- entirely self-sufficient,
- all governance and decision-making are done by the church members and leadership, and
- design and implement their own mission and programming.

Do me a favor, think about why you came to Aldersgate and why you stayed, and jot them down. Next, look at the two different lists above and see how your responses align with them. You just might find it interesting.
