A LEGACY OF LOVE AND APPLES: THE STORY OF ALDERSGATE'S PIE MINISTRY

It started, as many good things do, with one woman and a recipe.

In 1992, Jean Logan gathered with the United Methodist Women's Group with a simple but powerful idea: to make pies to help reduce the church debt. What began with around 12 bushels of apples and 200 pies soon became a tradition that has nourished Aldersgate's ministry for more than three decades.



Jean's mother handed down the recipes that became the heart of the ministry, one for the crust, taken from a can of Spry shortening, and one for the filling, discovered on the back of a can of lard. Jean faithfully tested and adapted the recipe until she could coax 15 pies out of a three-pound can. Today, Crisco has replaced the lard, but the spirit of stewardship remains the same.

In the early years, nothing was wasted; even the apple peels were boiled down into jelly, until the task became too much alongside pie-making itself. In 1993, the group used 25 bushels of apples, even experimenting with cherry pies for a season, before focusing fully on the apple pies that are now a hallmark of Aldersgate. Each year, an additional five bushels of apples were added until 50 bushels of apples were being used to make pies. It wasn't until COVID hit that 50 bushels became too much to manage.

Hands at Work, Hearts in Service



Since the beginning, every pie has been shaped by the hands of volunteers. The work unfolds in two stages: one to prepare the filling, another to make the crusts, fill pans, and top each pie. On pie-making days, at any given time, around 25 to 30 people gather in the church kitchen peeling, slicing, stirring, and assembling. The air hums with chatter, laughter, and the occasional good-natured debate over who makes the best-looking lattice.

Each pie is offered in two varieties, lattice-topped or crumb-topped, and each one carries a signature touch: three hearts cut from leftover dough, a symbol of the love baked into each dessert. They are frozen and sold unbaked, with instructions for finishing at home so families can enjoy the aroma of fresh pie filling their kitchens.

The first year, apples were bought at Nixa Hardware from a peddler. Since 1993, they have been donated by Peters Orchards in Waverly, MO, which was founded by Susan Harbison's great-grandfather. The tradition of apple donations began with Susan's parents, a gift that has been faithfully carried on year after year. This generous gift makes the continuation of the ministry possible. Until this year, every apple was peeled by hand, a true labor of love. In 2025, the team will introduce a few electric peelers to the process, lightening the load while keeping the tradition strong.



Stewards of the Work

Over the years, the project chair position has been faithfully passed from one set of hands to another. After Jean Logan's pioneering efforts, others stepped in to guide the ministry, including Barb McCalley, Susan Harbison, and Ron Grant. In 2022, Vickie Giesen took over, and this year marks her fourth season of organizing the apple pie project. Around ten dedicated individuals now oversee the logistics, while dozens more contribute their time and energy during the pie-making weeks.

Preaching, Teaching, Healing

MATTHEW 9: 35-38 NIV

Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples: "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into the harvest field."

- 1. Preaching

- 3 Jesus heals. Everywhere he goes, he is causing the blind to see, the lame to walk, cleansing the leper, raising the dead, feeding the hungry, and mingling with the sinners. He heals hearts, homes, communities, cities, and nations.

His main goal is not just to make us compassionate; His goal is to put his own heart for people into us. He knows the only way the mercy of God moves is one person or heart at a time – from one heart to another.

Jesus doesn't call us to pray for the sheep. He calls us to pray for the workers.

We are blessed to be a blessing to others.



In the early days, freezers at Price Cutter, Harter House, and Least of These, Inc. were called upon to store the finished pies, a logistical juggling act that required extra planning. Today, the church has its own collection of freezers, allowing every pie to be prepared, stored, and distributed right at Aldersgate.

A Ministry that Multiplies

At its core, this ministry is about more than apples, flour, and sugar. It's about people coming together, working side-by-side, sharing stories, and laughing over sticky counters and flour-dusted aprons. It's about a recipe that has been passed down, not just in flavor, but in spirit.



Even though there are no pre-orders, and the pies are only sold in person by word of mouth, the community has come to count on them each fall. They are sold at the bargain price \$15, though the true value is found in what they represent: love, fellowship, and faith at work.

The reach of this ministry is far greater than the kitchen. Though the earliest years weren't fully documented, the Apple Pie Ministry's efforts from 1997 through 2024 brought in more than \$166,114 to reduce the church's debt. In 2020 and 2021, the ovens fell silent due to COVID-19, but the tradition returned stronger than ever. In 2024 alone, 421 pies were sold, a 1/3 to 1/2 of which were gone in just two days, with the rest selling out in just two weeks. This year, with five extra bushels of apples, the team expects to produce around 500 pies.

The Sweetness of Service



Every pie carries more than apples and sugar between its crusts; it carries the prayers, laughter, and fellowship of the people who made it. It's a living testimony that when God's people come together, even the simplest ingredients can be transformed into something extraordinary.

If you ask the volunteers why they keep coming back year after year, the answer won't be about money. It will be about memories, the joy of working

side-by-side, and the way a simple pie can bring people together - volunteers in the kitchen, families

around a table, and a congregation bound closer by tradition.

More than just a fundraiser, the Apple Pie Ministry is a story of faithfulness. It is a reminder that small acts, done with love, can grow into a legacy. What started with a mother's recipe and a handful of willing hearts, has become a ministry that has blessed a church, a community, and all who have shared in its fruit.

Year-to-date financial summary through August 31, 2025:

Revenue \$ 840,990 Budgeted Expenses \$ 958,341 Actual Expenses \$ 800,557 Net \$ 40,433

The original amount of the loan for the new Learning Center was \$4,162,200.

The current balance as of August 31, 2025, is \$2,929,495.

We are in the midst of annual budgeting season at Aldersgate, where we begin to make plans for the next year. In a couple of Pastor Dennis' sermons recently, he has mentioned the idea of looking for "God's plan for my life" versus living "my life for God's plan." This has reminded me of how we develop our budget and then manage our finances during the year. We want to always be focused on furthering God's plan, no matter which month we are in on the calendar. As our budget is developed, we should first think "how much can we do?" and not "how much will we have?" Of course, we have to be good stewards and not commit recklessly, but budget season is a time of strengthening our faith as we strive to do evermore for God's plan.

The evening of Thursday, October 9, Aldersgate will host a financial planning seminar that will feature experts in law, tax, and retirement planning. There will be great information shared on financial planning in general, while also touching on how to effectively include the church and other important organizations in your plans.
